	PLANNING APPLICATION: 152352. LAND TO THE NORTH OF MILL BUILDINGS WAKES COLNE MILLS, COLCHESTER ROAD, WAKES COLNE, COLCHESTER, CO6 2BY. PROPOSED ERECTION OF 6 NO. DWELLINGS WITH ASSOCIATED GARAGES AND PARKING WITH NEW SHARED ACCESS AND ASSOCIATED WORKS.	
	Cllrs discussed this application. Although not in Chappel, residents are affected by the development so Cllrs decided that comments should be made to CBC.	
	The Council agreed to object to this application on the following grounds:	
	This application falls outside the settlement boundary and although being included in the call for sites, the process has not been concluded and therefore should hold no bearing on this current application.	
	The Council are concerned regarding the overdevelopment of the site and in turn the increased amount of traffic which will need to use a single track lane to access the properties, with no passing point on its stretch.	
	 Access to and from the site is from the A1124, which at this particular point has poor visibility in both directions. This part of the road in question has issues with water/ice coupled with the fact that although marked as a 30mph road, many motorists exceed this. This has been a problem site for accidents and ClIrs noted that several have taken place this year. 	
	Cllrs also asked the Clerk to contact Highways in order to confirm that a site visit took place prior to their decision.	CLERK

Cllr Chillingworth confirmed that he had written to the Police Crimes Commissioner to complain about the lack of assistance. He was also concerned that no signs were put up to warn drivers of the danger ahead.	
	The Clerk reported that CBC had made contact with the owners regarding the planting scheme. This was to be undertaken by an external party. No time scale was given.	
	Cllr Chamley had received reports that there was now no fencing around the site and that children from the properties were going onto neighbours land. Cllrs asked the Clerk to write to CBC reporting this and asking for a site visit to occur in order to ensure that all conditions were being met.	CLERK

	Site reference 114 was not on the plan. Further information had been requested from the land owner and at the time of the meeting nothing had been received. Sandra agreed to keep the PC informed if this changed.

	Cllr Chamley confirmed that an update had been received from Cllr Anne Brown confirming that a Maintenance Team had identified several blocked gullies in the area which need to be cleared. Drainage works have now been raised to address this and it is anticipated that the gully clearance will be carried out in January 2016. As part of the engineer's investigation into the gullies, a water leak was also observed. Anglian Water have been made aware of this issue and been asked to investigate and repair the problem.			
	A number of the ditches adjoining the roads in the area were also assessed as being blocked. The Maintenance Team is currently in the process of contacting the relevant landowners to alert them to the issue and remind them of their obligations in keeping the waterways clear.
