#### 1) SPEED WATCH

Cllr Ingram raised the broken 30mph sign near Broom Corner. The Clerk confirmed that this had already been reported to Essex County Council. Cllrs asked if the Clerk could raise this again along with the hedge needing to be cut around the sign.
