	PLANNING APPLICATION: 241710. LAND OFF OF OAK ROAD, CHAPPEL. THE PROPOSED WORKS CONSIST OF PROPOSED GATES AND FENCING.						
	Several residents had contacted the Parish Council regarding concerns over the site rather than the application for the gates and fencing.						
	Cllr Chamley read out the comments made by the Parish Council with regard to the previous application and confirmed that Colchester City Council had approved the application, no response from the Planning Department had been received over the comments made.						
	The applicant, as present, was asked if they were willing to talk about the site and confirmed that the levelling of the land was so that the barn could be placed on level ground. The Enforcement Team had been on site along with the Police to look at the Badger set and they had been advised to keep away from the area. Access to the land had been given as a neighbourly gesture for dog walking to some neighbouring properties.						
	Residents were informed that comments to Colchester City Council Planning Department were redacted before being placed on the website whether they were for or against a planning application. Cllr Neubauer confirmed that the applicant can ask Cllr Sunnucks to visit the site if they wish.
